| CA Prop 65 - Ceramicware Food and Beverage Use Products - Interior | ASTM C738-94 (R2006) (San Francisco Superior Court, 938430)                        | Ceramic ware items which are intended to come in contact with food or liquid must meet the following limits for extractable lead and cadmium or contain the CA Prop 65 warning:<br><b>LEAD:</b><br>Flatware 0.226 ppm<br>Hollowware 0.100 ppm<br><b>CADMIUM:</b><br>Flatware 1.853 ppm<br>Small Hollowware 0.189 ppm<br>Large Hollowware 0.049 ppm<br>Product passing FDA limits but failing the above stated Prop 65 limits must be labeled accordingly. |
| Stainless Steel Verification: Food Use                             | FDA GRAS   | Burlington Stores requires the suppliers of Stainless Steel to use stainless steel that meets FDA regulations and recommendation for food contact materials   |
| Total heavy metals in packaging                                    | Toxics in Packaging Clearinghouse (TPCH)   | Packaging shall not contain the sum of mercury, cadmium, lead and chromium (VI) in concentration above 0.01% by weight.   |
| Plastic Bag Warnings   | Various state laws   | Plastic bags with a thickness of less than 1 mil (0.001 inch) having an opened end larger than 5 inches in diameter shall contain the following warning statement or equivalent:<br><b>WARNING: To avoid danger of suffocation, keep this plastic bag away from babies and children. Do not use this bag in cribs, beds, carriages or playpens. This bag is not a toy.</b>  |
